Yet, as per the literature, lack of research attention has been given to the theoretical blend of parent guidance and partenting style towards students' academic activities performance in developing countries. Student performance is viewed as one of the prime elements in developing the human capital of a country. Parental guidance in review of literature has been defined in a variety of ways. Parents guidance is generally the involvement of parents in the children's academic activities education process with the aim of improving their academic activities as well as Social value Pattern.
